Climate Change

Given the recent storms, this report sent by Northern Powergrid to DEFRA may be of interest.

The report sets out how Northern Powergrid is taking action to adapt to climate change, by reporting on how it is addressing current and future climate impacts.

This report was invited by Defra under the adaptation reporting power under the Climate Change Act 2008.

S137 limit for 2022/203

DLUHC have set the amount as £8.82 per elector for 2022/2023.

S137 is a general power for parish, town and community councils to spend their own funds on projects for which there may not be a specific power.

The maximum amount is calculated by multiplying the set figure by the number of local government electors within the parish, town or community.
