#### **Digital Meetings**

As colleagues may be aware, there is a case in the High Court seeking a decision that councils can continue to hold digital meetings even after the lapse of the specific power in the Coronavirus Act 2020.

The public listings of cases show that the judgment is expected to be issued late this afternoon (Wed 28 April).

We anticipate dispatching initial details to to the Chairmen and Clerks of Member Councils this evening.
